2010 Accomplishments

- ◆ Hired a **library assistant** to help with technical services, customer service, programming, and database management;



Library Stitching Circle
February 2010

- ◆ Held dozens of lifelong learning programs for adults, including the **One Book One Community** project, the **Unusual Film Series**, the **World Affairs Series**, a monthly **book club**, and a weekly **stitching circle**;

- ◆ Established a new **Ready to Read in Roslyn** program to deliver book bags full of early literacy materials to all newborn,

upper county babies, and initiated a new voucher system called the **Dragonfly Club** to distribute books to low income children through HopeSource;

- ◆ Added dozens of historical photographs to the **Roslyn Heritage Collection**, a collection of digital photographs and audio files available on the Internet;

- ◆ Held the **Summer Reading Program** in which 316 children participated in events and spent over 1,600 hours reading for fun;

- ◆ Surveyed library users to help prioritize and plan;

- ◆ Replaced and upgraded computers;

- ◆ **City started construction on Phase I of the building renovation project!**
